#### Why not apply for a place online?

If your child was born between 1 September 2020 and 31 August 2021 they will be due to start primary school in September 2025.

You **MUST** complete an application form either online at **www.dudley.gov.uk/admissions** or by completing an application form from your home local authority by **15 JANUARY 2025**. You can include five school preferences on the application; there is nothing to gain by only putting one preference.

Applications will be available from 1 October 2024.

- It's quick and easy to use
- You can apply 24 hours a day, 7 days a week
- There's no risk that your application will be lost in the post
- You will get email confirmation that your application has been received
- It's safe and secure

The online system will be available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week from 1 October 2024 until the closing date for applications on **15 January 2025**.

**Please note:** Even if your child already attends a school nursery or has an older sibling at school, do not assume that your child will automatically gain a place at that school. This is a common misconception and often the biggest cause of disappointment for parents who believe otherwise.

Blue 5 attendance is 82.41%


Red 6 attendance is 83.00%





We have launched a new reading curriculum and have lots of exciting books we will be using to teach reading throughout school.

#### Class Information



1 - Nursery - Important Information

Well that was a very different week to what we were expecting. But the children had a lot of fun exploring our changing environment. Being the first out on the field to explore, make a snowman and have a snowball fight was so much fun, although the amount of times the children aimed a snowball at me, I'm surprised non actually went down my back!

As promised, I did remember our Ipad this week so we were able to take a lot of pictures of all the fun we had down there, although I nearly forgot it when coming back to class!!! The children are really enjoying all the activities. I'm especially proud of the children, who with a little encouragement, were able to jump around in the muddy puddles just like Peppa pig.

This week we have been looking at pattern in our maths work and thinking about things that repeat. We have sang songs, and used objects to make a pattern using the same thing over and over again.

We have also been learning about the sound "i" this week in our phonics.

I know I said it while you were in Nursery last Friday, but that was my favourite time last week. It was so lovely to see the vast majority of you reading with your child. Reading is so vital in their young lives. The biggest way you can help their education is to read a good bedtime story every single night. We can see why your children are so brilliant with the support you showed last week, so once again, a big massive thank you.





























We had lots of fun in Reception this week due to our wintery weather that took us all by surprise. On Tuesday morning, the children had a fabulous time playing in the snow. We wrapped up really warm and made our way to our school field which was an exciting first experience in itself! We enjoyed feeling the snow crunching under our feet, feeling it in our hands and making snowmen with our friends.

Back in the classroom, we then got creative and used wintery colours to create some snow inspired art work. We also watched The Snowman and talked about our own experiences of the snow.

The snow theme then continued through the week and we found out that when snow melts it turns into water by filling up a bucket of sand and bringing it inside. What a memorable week!









#### **Phonics**

This week the children have learnt the phonemes z, qu and ch. Please look out for their homework on Teams.

#### **Book Bags**

Please try to remember to send your child into school with their book bag every day just in case we need it in class during the day.



Year 1 thoroughly enjoyed the snow on Tuesday in our Forest School sessions. The Ezone was turned into a winter wonderland. The children enjoyed themselves jumping in the snow. It was great fun making tracks in the new snow and observing animal tracks. Some of the children made snow figures and shook the apple branches to make their own snowstorms. Back in the classroom, the children have shared winter stories like *One Snowy Night* by Nick Butterworth. In History, the children have played with old fashioned toys. In phonics, the children have been working on the new digraphs *ir*, *ie*, *ue* and *u* as in the word *unicorn*. New spellings are set on Teams and addition number facts to learn. 10 minutes a day practising recall facts will help your child's confidence.

# Year 2







Year 2 have enjoyed the snow this week! We have been going out for winter walks every day and have noticed how different our playground looks in the frosty weather.

This week, we will be sending home the children's lines to learn for our Nativity play in December. If you can, please spend some time at home learning your words off by heart. Thank you!

#### Year 3



We're excited to share how much the children have been enjoying their time walking in the snow! Whether exploring the snowy paths, making footprints in the fresh powder, or simply taking in the beauty of winter, they've been having such a wonderful time.

These snowy walks are not only fun but also a great way for the children to stay active and connect with nature and to have some fresh air between lessons.

In English this week we have continued to focus on the text called 'The Door'. We have used our senses to explore and describe a beach scene, just like Billy in the story. The children produced some excellent pieces of writing and even managed to include ambitious vocabulary like mesmerising, emitting and isolated.

We have also been reading our book 'The Iron Man' for guided reading sessions. The children have worked very hard to understand and compare characters using the text. Each reading session the children have had the opportunity to read an extract of the text using expression. They are looking forward to reading Chapter 3 to find out what happens to the Iron Man.

During Mathematics, the children have been exploring multiplication and division, including application of the multiples 3 and 4 and using the inverse of each operation.

In Science lessons, the children have been looking at forces and enjoyed learning about magnets. They investigated what materials are magnetic and were very surprised to find out that all metals are not magnetic!

This week has definitely been a little bit different! The children have enjoyed walks in the snow, especially on Tuesday morning when it was snowing. During this time, the children

even recited words 'Crunch, crunch, crunch...' from our class novel 'The Legend of Podkin One-Ear'. In reading, the children have explored 'Who was the hero or heroine?' As well as whether Crama was a victim or a villain?'. All classes had a great discussion.


In English, the children have planned their own portal stories based on 'Elf Road' and have written the first parts of their stories. Each class has come up with lots of interesting ideas, and objects that their main character has taken back into the real world. We can't wait to finish them next week!

In Science, the children worked collaboratively to make a simple circuit with a buzzer. They were then given a task to make a small version of a buzz-wire game, this helped them to understand how switches work in a circuit.



It was lovely to see the children light up with wonder wandering around at break times, being able to take part in such a unique weather condition.


In maths, we are still looking at fractions, right up until Christmas. Next week, we will be looking at adding and subtracting mixed number fractions and fractions less than and greater than 1.

In English, we have come to the end of our narrative topic around 'The Key' and have created and edited fantastic stories, built suspense and atmosphere while developing our characters. We have been using figurative language, parenthesis, adverbials, powerful adjectives, similes, metaphors and personification.

We have also started our D.T. topic and have been designing our own 'war' vehicles. We will then make these vehicles move using pulleys, axles and motors. Our vehicles aim is to destroy an egg with its own built in weapon!
