Year 2 attendance is 94.27%


Year 3 attendance is 94.43%



2 - Nursery - Important Information

We have been enjoying the Autumnal weather this week, and talking about the changes we can see with the leaves. If your children want to bring in any Autumn objects, like leaves, conkers, pine cones etc, to share with their friends, they are more than welcome.

Along side singing 'it's raining it pouring' we have been busy:

- Learning the nursery rhyme 'Twinkle Twinkle Little Star'
- Glueing and sprinkling glitter using our pincher grip to aid our fine motor skills.
- We have been exploring our new construction area and building walls and towers, even "houses" to aid our gross motor skills.
- Introducing name cards to talk about initial sounds for each name to introduce phonics into the timetable.

This term we will be learning lots of different Nursery Rhymes and I thought I'd take this opportunity to share a link to explain a little about why we are doing this to start our school year:

Another fantastic week in Reception. The children have continued reading our story about The Three Little pigs and they are now really good at doing the actions to the story. Everybody enjoyed exploring some real straw and trying to build a house with it. It was very tricky but it was fun pretending to be the wolf and huffing and puffing until the houses fell down! The children then used the straw to make some straw house collages and models. Lots of children chose to build a brick house and this involved some great team work and careful placing of the bricks.

Year 1 - This week in Forest School the children worked in teams to make dens out of logs, twigs and leaves. We were so lucky with the weather and the children had a great time. In English, the children have shared the story Daddy's Sandwich by Pip Jones and they have designed their own sandwich for someone in their family. They have had some interesting and creative ideas. Thank you for returning the Little Wandle books. The children have been given new reading books to return on Monday. Please let us know how they are getting on with their new books by writing in their reading records.





Year 2 are really enjoying their work in Science. They have been investigating the properties of materials and finding out which materials can be changed by squashing, bending, twisting and

stretching. They have enjoyed considering which materials are suited for which jobs. Can they tell you the definitions of vocabulary such as rigid, opaque, transparent?

In Art, the children have loved learning about the work of Paul Klee and imitating his art using different mediums.






This week Year 3 have had their second French lesson with Madame Jones who they have lessons with every two weeks. they continued to learn simple phrases including bonjour, ca va?, comment t'appelle tu? and je m'appelle. The children were able to say these to each other using puppets around the class.

The children have also enjoyed learning about healthy eating, looking at which foods should make up our daily diets.

It's been great seeing so many of you are regularly reading with your children at home through your comments in their reading diaries. Please continue to do so as reading a little every night can really help their development.









3 - Year 4 - Important Information

This week, year 4 have enjoyed planning and conducting an investigation to find out the time it takes for different types of chocolate to melt in Science. The children worked in small groups to carry out the investigation, observing and recording their results before analysing them.

In Art, children have learnt about impressionism - looking at the work of Claude Monet. This week we focussed on experimenting with creating texture using brushes, sponges and paper towels to create different effects.

We have also enjoyed writing our narrative stories based on 'Arthur and the Golden Rope'. It has been a pleasure to read some of their creative ideas.

On Friday 18th October, Year 4 have the exciting opportunity to watch a performance of David Walliams 'Awful Auntie' at the Alexandra Theatre, Birmingham. Please make sure you have returned your reply slip by Monday 30th September.

In Year 5 this week we have been creating some wonderful examples of watercolour Art linked to our topic of 'World War 1'. The children have been painting poppies in Flanders Fields after discussing


the significance and historical importance behind them. The children used various effects, such as bleeding, washes and perspective to capture some great work!

We are continuing to look at poetry in English and have started to create our very own examples! The themes can be quite intense and challenging but the children have been extremely mature and thoughtful when constructing their poems. They have used figurative language such as personification, similes and metaphors to describe and paint images in the readers mind!



In Maths next week, we will be continuing to cover addition and subtraction, while moving on to narrative writing around the book 'Friend or Foe'.


If you could please ensure you listen to your child read at least 3 times a week and sign this in their reading record! Thank you!
















7 - Year 6 - Important Information
